

11.0 Transportation Standards

Transportation is among the numerous types of related services required to assist a child or student with a disability to benefit from special education. Transportation includes travel to and from Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville schools, travel between the individual district's schools, travel in and around school buildings, and specialized equipment, if required to provide special transportation for a child or student.

The districts include the following buildings:

Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts have an obligation to ensure that providers of related services, such as transportation, are appropriately trained and qualified under the applicable state and federal standards; vehicles used to transport children or students with disabilities comply with all applicable state standards; and all children or students with disabilities, within each district's jurisdiction, are provided transportation to their educational program.

11.01 District Responsibility for Transportation of Pupils with Disabilities

11.01.01 Free Transportation

Legal Citations

Minnesota Statutes, sections [125A.03](#) to [125A.24](#), requires Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville school districts to provide special education and services for a school age resident with a disability. Accordingly, free transportation services must be provided to any such child with a disability who requires special transportation services because of the child's disabling conditions or special program needs.

Parts [7470.1600](#) and [7470.1700](#) apply to transportation of a child with a disability, as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section [125A.02](#), when the disabling conditions of the child are such that the child cannot be safely transported on the regular school bus route or when the child is transported on a special route for the purpose of attending an approved special education program.

Parts [7470.1600](#) and [7470.1700](#) are not applicable to parents who transport their own child under contract with Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, or St. Michael/Albertville school districts or nonpublic school.

11.01.02 Appeal Process

Legal Citations

Any parent of a child with a disability who believes that the transportation services provided for that child are not in compliance with parts [7470.1600](#) and [7470.1700](#) may utilize the due process procedures provided for in Minnesota Statutes, sections [125A.03](#) to [125A.24](#).

11.01.03 Length of Time in Transit

Legal Citations

The length of time a pupil with a disability is transported shall be appropriate to the physical, mental, and emotional well-being of the child. In general, a pupil with a disability should not spend more time in transit than a pupil without a disability except as may be required because of the unique location of the pupil's educational program.

11.01.04 Type of Vehicle

Legal Citations

The school districts of Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville shall determine the type of vehicle used to transport pupils with a disability on the basis of the disabling conditions of those pupils. These vehicles must comply with Minnesota Statutes, section [169.4504](#).

11.01.05 Determination of Additional Assistance

Legal Citations

Vehicles used to transport pupils with a must be equipped with a two-way communications system and/or have a responsible aide, or both, to provide necessary assistance and supervision that cannot safely be provided by the driver. Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville school districts may determine that neither a communication system nor an aide is required. The determination of whether a communication system and/or an aide are required must reflect the needs of the pupils and be based on such factors as disabilities of pupils transported, distance traveled, density

of population, terrain, and any other factors which may affect the safety of the pupil passengers. Exceptions to this paragraph may be made upon mutual agreement between the parents and the school district.

11.01.06 Special Equipment [See 11.07 for Wheelchair Securement Devices]

Legal Citations

Specially adapted seats, support, and/or protective devices must be provided for all pupils who require such devices to insure their safe transportation. Such devices must be selected by the Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville school districts in consultation with the pupil's parents and on the basis of the specific needs of the individual pupil with a disability.

11.01.07 Nonacademic Services Include Transportation

Legal Citations

Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville school districts must take steps, including the provision of supplementary aids and services determined appropriate and necessary by the child's IEP Team, to provide nonacademic and extracurricular services and activities in the manner necessary to afford children with disabilities an equal opportunity for participation in those services and activities.

Nonacademic and extracurricular services and activities may include counseling services, athletics, transportation, health services, recreational activities, special interest groups or clubs sponsored by the public agency, referrals to agencies that provide assistance to individuals with disabilities and employment of students, including both employment by the public agency and assistance in making outside employment available.

11.02 School District Bus Safety Responsibilities

11.02.01 Comprehensive Policy

Legal Citations

Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts shall develop and implement a comprehensive, written policy governing pupil transportation safety, including transportation of nonpublic school students, when applicable. The policy, at minimum, must contain:

1. provisions for appropriate student bus safety training under section [123B.90](#);
2. rules governing student conduct on school buses and in school bus loading and unloading areas;
3. a statement of parent or guardian responsibilities relating to school bus safety;
4. an intradistrict system for reporting school bus accidents or misconduct and a system for dealing with local law enforcement officials in cases of criminal conduct on a school bus;
5. a discipline policy to address violations of school bus safety rules, including procedures for revoking a student's bus riding privileges in cases of serious or repeated misconduct;

6. a system for integrating school bus misconduct records with other discipline records;
7. where applicable, provisions governing bus monitor qualifications, training, and duties;
8. rules governing the use and maintenance of type III vehicles, drivers of type III vehicles, qualifications to drive a type III vehicle, qualifications for a type III vehicle and the circumstances under which a student may be transported in a type III vehicle;
9. operating rules and procedures;
10. emergency procedures;
11. a system for maintaining and inspecting equipment; and
12. any other requirements of Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville school districts.

11.02.02 School Transportation Safety Director

Legal Citations

Each board in the districts of Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville shall designate a school transportation safety director to oversee and implement pupil transportation safety policies. The director shall have day-to-day responsibility for pupil transportation safety within Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts, including transportation of nonpublic school children when provided by the district.

11.03 Drivers and Aides for Pupils with Disabilities

11.03.01 Drivers Generally

Legal Citations

Each driver of a vehicle for pupils with a disability shall be carefully selected to assure the driver can perform the requirements of the job. Drivers must be assigned to each route on a regular basis whenever possible.

11.03.02 Information Necessary

Legal Citations

Each aide assigned to a vehicle transporting pupils with a disability, or driver if no aide is assigned, or both, shall have available to them in the vehicle a typewritten card indicating:

- A. the pupil's name and address;
- B. the nature of the pupil's disabilities;
- C. emergency health care information; and
- D. the names and telephone numbers of the pupil's physician, parents, guardians, or custodians, and some person other than the pupil's parents or custodians who can be contacted in case of an emergency.

Training 11.03.03

Legal Citations

Each driver and aide assigned to a vehicle transporting pupils with a disability must:

- A. be instructed in basic first aid and procedures for the pupils under their care;
- B. within one month after the effective date of assignment, participate in a program of in-service training on the proper methods for dealing with the specific needs and problems of pupils with disabilities;
- C. assist pupils with disabilities on and off the bus when necessary for their safe ingress and egress from the bus; and
- D. ensure that protective safety devices, as required in part [7470.1600](#), subpart 6, are in use and fastened properly.

11.04 General Considerations

11.04.01 Transportation of a Person with a Disability to a Developmental Achievement Center

Legal Citations

The school boards in Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville must contract with any licensed developmental achievement center attended by a resident person with a disability who fulfills the eligibility requirements, to transport the resident student with a disability to the developmental achievement center in return for payment by the center of the cost of the transportation, if transportation by the board is in the best interest of the person with a disability and is not unreasonably burdensome to the district and if a less expensive, reasonable, alternative means of transporting the person with a disability does not exist. If the board and the developmental achievement center are unable to agree to a contract, either the board or the center may appeal to the commissioner to resolve the conflict. All decisions of the commissioner shall be final and binding upon the board and the center.

11.04.02 Transportation of Pupils Receiving Instruction in Nonresident District

Legal Citations

The school boards of Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville may provide for the instruction of any resident pupil in another district when inadequate room, distance to school, unfavorable road conditions, or other facts or conditions make attendance in the pupil's own district unreasonably difficult or impractical, in which case such district shall pay to the district so attended the tuition agreed upon or charged, pursuant to section [123A.488](#), subdivision 2, and may provide transportation; provided, that such pupil shall continue to be a pupil of the district of residence for the payment of apportionment and other state aids.

When Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts provide instruction and services in a day program outside the district of residence, the district of residence is responsible for providing transportation. When one of these districts provides instruction and services requiring board and lodging or placement in a residential program outside the district of residence, the nonresident district in which the child is placed is responsible for providing transportation. Transportation costs shall be paid by the district responsible for providing transportation and the state shall pay transportation aid to that district.

For the purposes of this subdivision, a “nonresident pupil” is a pupil who resides in one district, defined as the “resident district” and attends school in another district, defined as the “nonresident district.”

If requested, a nonresident district shall transport a nonresident pupil within its borders and may transport a nonresident pupil within the pupil’s resident district. If a nonresident district decides to transport a nonresident pupil within the pupil’s resident district, the nonresident district must notify the pupil’s resident district of its decision, in writing, prior to providing transportation.

11.04.03 Transportation of Pupils who Attend in Another District

Legal Citations

No resident of a Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, or St. Michael/Albertville district who is eligible for special instruction and services pursuant to this section may be denied provision of this instruction and service because of attending a public school in another district pursuant to Minn. Stat. [123B.88](#), subd. 5, if the attendance is not subject to Minn. Stat. [124D.08](#). If the pupil attends a public school located in a contiguous district and the district of attendance does not provide special instruction and services, the district of residence must provide necessary transportation for the pupil between the boundary of the district of residence and the educational facility where special instruction and services are provided within the district of residence. The district of residence may provide necessary transportation for the pupil between its boundary and the school attended in the contiguous district, but must not pay the cost of transportation provided outside the boundary of the district of residence.

11.04.04 Transportation to and from a Neutral Site for Private School Students

Legal Citations

If necessary for the child to benefit from or participate in the services provided under this part, a parentally-placed private school child with a disability must be provided transportation:

- A. from the child’s school or the child’s home to a site other than the private school; and
- B. from the service site to the private school, or to the child’s home, depending on the timing of the services.

Districts are not required to provide transportation from the child’s home to the private school.

11.04.05 Special Instruction; Nonpublic Schools

Legal Citations

No resident of a Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, or St. Michael/Albertville district who is eligible for special instruction and services under this section may be denied instruction and service on a shared time basis, because of attending a nonpublic school. If a resident pupil with a disability attends a nonpublic school located within the district of residence, the Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts must provide necessary transportation for that pupil within the district between the nonpublic school and the educational facility where special instruction and services are provided on a shared time basis. If a resident pupil with a disability attends a nonpublic school located in another district and if no agreement exists, for providing special instruction and services on a shared time basis to that pupil by the district of attendance and where the special instruction and services are provided within the district of residence, the district of residence must provide necessary transportation for that pupil between the boundary of the district of residence and the educational facility. The district of residence may provide necessary transportation for that pupil between its boundary and the nonpublic school attended, but the nonpublic school must pay the cost of transportation provided outside the district boundary.

Parties serving students on a shared time basis have access to the due process hearing system. In the event it is determined under these systems that the nonpublic school or staff impeded the public school district's provision of a free appropriate education, the commissioner may withhold public funds available to the nonpublic school proportionally applicable to that student under section [123B.42](#).

11.04.06 Transportation of Students in Open Enrollment Options

Legal Citations

If requested by the parent of a pupil, the nonresident district shall provide transportation within the Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts.

The resident district is not required to provide or pay for transportation between the pupil's residence and the border of the nonresident district. A parent may be reimbursed by the nonresident district for the costs of transportation from the pupil's residence to the border of the nonresident district if the pupil is from a family whose income is at or below the poverty level, as determined by the federal government. The reimbursement may not exceed the pupil's actual cost of transportation or 15 cents per mile traveled, whichever is less. Reimbursement may not be paid for more than 250 miles per week.

At the time a nonresident district notifies a parent or guardian that an application has been accepted under subdivision 4 or 5, the nonresident district must provide the parent or guardian with the following information regarding the transportation of nonresident pupils under section [123B.88](#), subdivision 6.

11.04.07 Area Learning Center Pupils

Legal Citations

Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts may provide bus transportation along the school bus routes established to provide nonregular transportation when space is available, for pupils attending programs at an area learning center. The transportation is only permitted between schools and if it does not increase the district's expenditures for transportation. The cost of these services shall be considered part of the authorized cost for nonregular transportation for the purpose of section [123B.92](#).

11.04.09 Providing Transportation for Pre-Kindergarten Early Childhood Special Education Pupils

Legal Citations

The Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville boards may provide for the transportation of pupils to and from school and for any other purpose. These boards may also provide for the transportation of pupils to schools in other districts for grades and departments not maintained in the district, including high school, at the expense of the district, when funds are available therefore and if agreeable to the district to which it is proposed to transport the pupils, for the whole or a part of the school year, as it may deem advisable, and subject to its rules. In any district, the board must arrange for the attendance of all pupils living two miles or more from the school, except pupils whose transportation privileges have been voluntarily surrendered under subdivision 2, or whose privileges have been revoked under section [123B.91](#), subdivision 1, clause (6), or [123B.90](#), subdivision 2. The district may provide for the transportation of or the boarding and rooming of the pupils who may be more economically and conveniently provided for by that means. Arrangements for attendance may include a requirement that parents or guardians request transportation before it is provided. The board must provide transportation to and from the home of a child with a disability not yet enrolled in kindergarten when special instruction and services under sections [125A.03](#) to [125A.24](#), [125A.26](#) to [125A.48](#), and [125A.65](#) are provided in a location other than in the child's home. When transportation is provided, scheduling of routes, establishment of the location of bus stops, manner and method of transportation, control and discipline of school children, the determination of fees, and any other matter relating thereto must be within the sole discretion, control, and management of the board. The district may provide for the transportation of pupils or expend a reasonable amount for room and board of pupils whose attendance at school can more economically and conveniently be provided for by that means or who attend school in a building rented or leased by a district within the confines of an adjacent district.

11.04.10 Custodial Parent Transportation

Legal Citations

The Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville boards may provide transportation for a pupil who is a custodial parent and that pupil's child between the pupil's home and a child care provider and between the provider and the school. The board must establish criteria for transportation it provides according to this subdivision.

11.04.11 Pupil Transport on Staff Development Days

Legal Citations

Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts may provide bus transportation between home and school for pupils on days devoted to parent-teacher conferences, teacher's workshops, or other staff development opportunities. If approved by the commissioner as part of a program of educational improvement, the cost of providing this transportation, as determined by generally accepted accounting principles, must be considered part of the authorized cost for regular transportation for the purposes of section [123B.92](#). The commissioner shall approve inclusion of these costs in the regular transportation category only if the total number of instructional hours in the school year divided by the total number of days for which transportation is provided equals or exceeds the number of instructional hours per day prescribed in the rules of the Department of Education.

11.04.12 Placement of Children without Disabilities; Education and Transportation

Legal Citations

The responsibility for providing instruction and transportation for a pupil without a disability who has a short-term or temporary physical or emotional illness or disability, as determined by the standards of the commissioner, and who is temporarily placed for care and treatment for that illness or disability, must be determined as provided in this section.

- A. The school district of residence of the pupil is the district in which the pupil's parent or guardian resides.
- B. When parental rights have been terminated by court order, the legal residence of a child placed in a residential or foster facility for care and treatment is the district in which the child resides.
- C. Before the placement of a pupil for care and treatment, the district of residence must be notified and provided an opportunity to participate in the placement decision. When an immediate emergency placement is necessary and time does not permit resident district participation in the placement decision, the district in which the pupil is temporarily placed, if different from the district of residence, must notify the district of residence of the emergency placement within 15 days of the placement.
- D. When a pupil without a disability is temporarily placed for care and treatment in a day program and the pupil continues to live within the district of residence during the care and treatment, the district of residence must provide instruction and necessary transportation to and from the treatment facility for the pupil. Transportation shall only be provided by the district during regular operating hours of the district. The district may provide the instruction at a school within the district of residence, at the pupil's residence, or in the case of a placement outside of the resident district, in the district in which the day treatment program is located by paying tuition to that district. The district of placement may contract with a facility to provide instruction by teachers licensed by the state Board of Teaching.
- E. When a pupil without a disability is temporarily placed in a residential program for care and treatment, the district in which the pupil is placed must provide instruction for the pupil and necessary transportation while the pupil is receiving instruction, and in the case of a placement outside of the district of residence, the nonresident district must bill the district of residence for the actual cost of providing the instruction for the regular school year and for summer school, excluding transportation costs. When a pupil without a disability is temporarily placed in a residential program outside the district of residence, the administrator of the court placing the

pupil must send timely written notice of the placement to the district of residence. The district of placement may contract with a residential facility to provide instruction by teachers licensed by the state Board of Teaching. For purposes of this section, the state correctional facilities operated on a fee-for-service basis are considered to be residential programs for care and treatment.

- F. The district of residence must include the pupil in its residence count of pupil units and pay tuition as provided in section [123A.488](#) to the district providing the instruction. Transportation costs must be paid by the district providing the transportation and the state must pay transportation aid to that district. For purposes of computing state transportation aid, pupils governed by this subdivision must be included in the disabled transportation category.

11.05 Specific Situations of Transportation of Pupils with Disabilities

11.05.01 Minnesota State Academies — Responsibility for Services

Legal Citations

Responsibility for special instruction and services for a blind/visually impaired or deaf/hard of hearing child attending the Minnesota State Academy for the Deaf or the Minnesota State Academy for the Blind must be determined in subdivisions 2 to 10.

The legal residence of the child is the district in which the child's parent or guardian resides.

Minn. Stat. 125A.65, subd. 2

When it is determined pursuant to section [125A.69](#), subdivision 1 or 2, that the child is entitled to attend either school, the board of the Minnesota State Academies must provide the appropriate educational program for the child. The board of the Minnesota State Academies must make a tuition charge to the child's district of residence for the cost of providing the program. The amount of tuition charged must not exceed the general education revenue formula allowance times the pupil unit weighting factor pursuant to section [126C.05](#) for that child, for the amount of time the child is in the program. The district of the child's residence must pay the tuition and may claim general education aid for the child. Tuition received by the board of the Minnesota State Academies, except for tuition received under subdivision 4, must be deposited in the state treasury as provided in subdivision 8.

When it is determined that the child can benefit from public school enrollment but that the child should also remain in attendance at the applicable school, the district where the institution is located must provide an appropriate educational program for the child and must make a tuition charge to the board of the Minnesota State Academies for the actual cost of providing the program, less any amount of aid received pursuant to section [125A.75](#). The board of the Minnesota State Academies must pay the tuition and other program costs including the unreimbursed transportation costs. Aids for children with a disability must be paid to the district providing the special instruction and services. Special transportation must be provided by the district providing the educational program and the state must reimburse that district within the limits provided by law.

11.05.02 Pupils Placed in Another District for Care and Treatment

Legal Citations

Pay Program Placement Outside of District

When Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts provide instruction and services in a day program outside the district of residence, the district of residence is responsible for providing transportation. When a district provides instruction and services requiring board and lodging or placement in a residential program outside the district of residence, the nonresident district in which the child is placed is responsible for providing transportation. Transportation costs shall be paid by the district responsible for providing transportation and the state shall pay transportation aid to that district.

Minn. Stat. 125A.11, subd. 2

When a child is temporarily placed for care and treatment in a day program located in another district and the child continues to live within the district of residence during the care and treatment, the district of residence is responsible for providing transportation to and from the care and treatment facility and an appropriate educational program for the child. Transportation shall only be provided by the district during regular operating hours of the district. Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts may provide the educational program at a school within the district of residence, at the child's residence, or in the district in which the day treatment center is located by paying tuition to that district.

Residential Program Placement

When a child is temporarily placed in a residential program for care and treatment, the nonresident district in which the child is placed is responsible for providing an appropriate educational program for the child and necessary transportation while the child is attending the educational program; and must bill the district of the child's residence for the actual cost of providing the program, as outlined in Minn. Stat. [125A.11](#). However, the board, lodging, and treatment costs incurred in behalf of a child with a disability placed outside of the school district of residence by the commissioner of human services or the commissioner of corrections or their agents, for reasons other than providing for the child's special educational needs must not become the responsibility of either the district providing the instruction or the district of the child's residence. For the purposes of this section, the state correctional facilities operated on a fee-for-service basis are considered to be residential programs for care and treatment.

Providing District

The district of residence shall pay tuition and other program costs, not including transportation costs, to the district providing the instruction and services. The district of residence may claim general education aid for the child as provided by law. Transportation costs must be paid by the district responsible for providing the transportation and the state must pay transportation aid to that district.

Board and Lodging for Nonresident Pupils with Disabilities

When Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts provide instruction and services in a day program outside the district of residence, the district of residence is responsible for providing transportation. When a Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts provide instruction and services requiring board and lodging or placement in a residential program outside the district of residence, the nonresident district in which the child is placed is responsible for providing transportation. Transportation costs shall be paid by the district responsible for providing transportation and the state shall pay transportation aid to that district.

11.05.03 Attendance in Another State

If high school pupils from a district within this state are being transported to a school in another state, the board of the district from which the pupils are being transported may provide free transportation and tuition for any or all of its elementary pupils to such school in another state and be entitled to state aid as provided by law.

Minn. Stat. 123B.88, subd. 7

The state must pay Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, or St. Michael/Albertville district the actual cost incurred in providing instruction and services for a child whose district of residence has been determined by section 125A.17 or 125A.51, paragraph (b), and who is temporarily placed in a state institution, a licensed residential facility, or foster facility for care and treatment. The regular education program at the facility must be an approved program according to section 125A.515.

Upon following the procedure specified by the commissioner, Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts may bill the state the actual cost incurred in providing the services including transportation costs and a proportionate amount of capital expenditures and debt service, minus the amount of the basic revenue, as defined in section 126C.10, subdivision 2, of the district for the child and the special education aid, transportation aid, and any other aid earned on behalf of the child. The limit in subdivision 2 applies to aid paid pursuant to this subdivision.

To the extent possible, the commissioner shall obtain reimbursement from another state for the cost of serving any child whose parent or guardian resides in that state. The commissioner may contract with the appropriate authorities of other states to effect reimbursement. All money received from other states must be paid to the state treasury and placed in the general fund.

11.06 Payments of and Aid for Transportation

Legal Citations

The state must pay Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, or St. Michael/Albertville district the actual cost incurred in providing instruction and services for a child whose district of residence has been determined by section 125A.17 or 125A.51, paragraph (b), and who is temporarily placed in a state institution, a licensed residential facility, or foster facility for care and treatment. The regular education program at the facility must be an approved program according to section 125A.515.

Upon following the procedure specified by the commissioner, the district of Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, or St. Michael/Albertville may bill the state the actual cost incurred in providing the services including transportation costs and a proportionate amount of capital expenditures and debt service, minus the amount of the basic revenue, as defined in section [126C.10](#), subdivision 2, of the district for the child and the special education aid, transportation aid, and any other aid earned on behalf of the child. The limit in subdivision 2 applies to aid paid pursuant to this subdivision.

To the extent possible, the commissioner shall obtain reimbursement from another state for the cost of serving any child whose parent or guardian resides in that state. The commissioner may contract with the appropriate authorities of other states to effect reimbursement. All money received from other states must be paid to the state treasury and placed in the general fund.

11.06.01 District Transportation Aid Agreements

Legal Citations

Notwithstanding the provisions of Minn. Stat. [125A.11](#), [125A.14](#), and [125A.15](#), when a child receives special instruction and services in a day program outside the resident district, the resident district and the nonresident district where the child is placed may enter into an agreement providing for the nonresident district to pay the cost of any particular transportation categories specified in Minn. Stat. [123B.92](#), subd. 1, and claim transportation aid for those categories. In this case, the nonresident district may not obtain any payment from the resident district for the categories covered by the agreement.

11.06.02 Summer Programs

Legal Citations

Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts may provide summer programs for children with a disability living within the district and nonresident children temporarily placed in the district pursuant to section [125A.15](#) or [125A.16](#). Prior to March 31 or 30 days after the child with a disability is placed in the district, whichever is later, the providing district shall give notice to the district of residence of any nonresident children temporarily placed in the district pursuant to section [125A.15](#) or [125A.16](#), of its intention to provide these programs. Notwithstanding any contrary provisions in sections [125A.15](#) and [125A.16](#), the district providing the special instruction and services must apply for special education aid for the summer program. The unreimbursed actual cost of providing the program for nonresident children with a disability, including the cost of board and lodging, may be billed to the district of the child's residence and must be paid by the resident district. Transportation costs must be paid by the district responsible for providing transportation pursuant to section [125A.15](#) or [125A.16](#) and transportation aid must be paid to that district.

11.06.03 Uniform Billing System for the Education Costs of Out-of-Home Placed Students

Legal Citations

The commissioner, in cooperation with the commissioners of human services and corrections and with input from appropriate billing system users, shall develop and implement a uniform billing system for school districts and other agencies, including private providers, who provide the educational services for students who are placed out of the home. The uniform billing system must:

1. allow for the proper and timely billing to Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts by service providers with a minimum amount of district administration;
2. allow Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville districts to bill the state for certain types of special education and regular education services as provided by law;
3. provide flexibility for the types of services that are provided for children placed out of the home, including day treatment services;
4. allow the commissioner to track the type, cost, and quality of services provided for children placed out of the home;
5. conform existing special education and proposed regular education billing procedures;
6. provide a uniform reporting standard of per diem rates;
7. determine allowable expenses and maximum reimbursement rates for the state reimbursement of care and treatment services according to section 124D.701; and
8. provide a process for the district to appeal to the commissioner tuition bills submitted to districts and to the state.

11.06.04 Cooperatives, Education Districts, and Intermediate Districts

Legal Citations

For purposes of this section, a special education cooperative, service cooperative, education district, or an intermediate district must allocate its approved expenditures for special education programs among participating districts. Special education aid for services provided by a cooperative, service cooperative, education district, or intermediate district must be paid to the participating school districts.

11.06.05 Travel Aid for Personnel Providing Home-based Services to Young Children

Legal Citations

The state must pay each district of Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, and St. Michael/Albertville one-half of the sum actually expended by the district for necessary travel of essential personnel providing home-based services to children with a disability under ages five and their families.

11.06.06 Aid Payment to District Providing Services

The aids provided for children with a disability must be paid to the districts of Becker, Big Lake, Monticello, or St. Michael/Albertville which is providing the special instruction and services. General education aid must be paid to the district of the pupil's residence. The total amount of aid paid may

not exceed the amount expended for children with a disability in the year for which the aid is paid.

11.07 Wheelchair Securement Device

11.07.01 Definition

Legal Citations

“Wheelchair securement device” or “securement device” is an apparatus installed in a transit vehicle or other vehicle for the purpose of securing an occupied wheelchair into a location in the vehicle and preventing movement of that wheelchair while the vehicle is in motion.

11.07.02 General Requirements

Legal Citations

Except as provided in subdivision 4, any vehicle used by an operator to provide transportation service shall be equipped with wheelchair securement devices which are approved by the commissioner of public safety as meeting the specifications of subdivisions 1 and 2. A wheelchair securement device shall prevent any forward, backward, or lateral movement of an occupied wheelchair when the device is engaged and the vehicle is in motion, accelerating or braking, and shall attach to the frame of the wheelchair without damaging it. Wheelchair securement devices installed in any vehicle shall be maintained in working order.

A school bus used to transport pupils in wheelchairs must be equipped with fastening devices that will hold the wheelchairs securely in a fixed position.

11.07.03 Strength Requirements

Legal Citations

The strength requirements for securing the part of a wheelchair that is forward in the vehicle shall be one-half of those required for the rear. Where the wheelchair securement device and the seatbelt are combined in a common system, those parts which provide the combined restraining force shall have a combined strength of both according to the strength requirements of each as adopted by the commissioner of public safety.

11.07.04 Maximum Number of Persons Transported

Legal Citations

A vehicle used to provide transportation service shall carry only as many persons seated in wheelchairs as the number of securement devices approved by the commissioner of public safety as meeting the

specifications of subdivisions 1 and 2 with which the vehicle is equipped, and each occupied wheelchair shall be secured by such a securement device before the vehicle is set in motion.

11.07.05 Transit Vehicle; Rules

Legal Citations

A transit vehicle used to provide transportation services may be equipped with wheelchair securement devices that may be engaged and released by the user or the user's assistant. The commissioner of public safety shall adopt rules as necessary to set standards for the operation, strength, and use of these.
